



## Broadbridge Heath major highways improvements

### Start of works

West Sussex County Council is undertaking highway improvement works during 2019 in the Broadbridge Heath area (see plan on reverse).

Throughout March, in advance of the main construction works, utility diversions and bridge parapet alteration works are taking place. Whilst some traffic management is required to ensure operatives safety during these works, this will cause minimal disruption to traffic.

The main construction works are due to start early April and last until Autumn 2019.

The project is being built by Jackson Civil Engineering. Initial activities will include site clearance and the establishment of traffic management.

At the same time as our works, there will continue to be construction works at the Abbey Developments housing site on the corner of the Broadbridge Way and Five Oaks Road and at Countryside Properties new Neighbourhood Centre.

To undertake our works, and to prepare for the downgrading of Broadbridge Way at the Neighbourhood Centre, Broadbridge Way is to be closed from early April 2019. The closure will also include the section of Billingshurst Road between Shelley Drive and Newbridge Roundabout.

The plan on the reverse side of this leaflet shows the closure area and the diversion routes, which will be clearly signed.

Access to the Bridge Leisure Centre, Tesco, Broadbridge Retail Park, Shell Garage and Hendy Ford will be maintained throughout the works generally as shown on the plan overleaf, although some day-to-day alterations to traffic management will be required to allow for localised construction work.

Details of the main closure, traffic management layouts (including any night time closures) and works schedule will be made available through the West Sussex County Council website (see website address below) – with regular updates on progress within the Broadbridge Heath Magazine.
