Project: Refurbishment of a Signalised Junction

I am pleased to inform you that as part of our continuing efforts to improve the highways, work is due to commence soon at the junction of West Common and Hickmans Lane, Lindfield

What we're doing

This project will include;

- Upgrading obsolete traffic signals equipment with new poles, traffic signals controller and more energy efficient LED traffic signal heads.
- The inclusion of additional detectors that will allow for priority to be returned to vehicles once the pedestrians are safely crossed meaning less time wasted.
- The creation of a new controlled crossing point, on the eastern side of the junction.
- Pedestrian tactile paving is to be replaced throughout the junction.
- Traffic Management will be used during the duration of the works.

When this will take place

The work will start on 28th January 2019 and is expected to take 6 weeks to complete. Our hours of work will *generally* be between 8:30am and 4:30pm.

Before the works start, we will erect advance warning signs in the local area, letting you know any changes to the start date and marking the extent of the works.
